Household Hazardous Waste Mobile Collection

The HHW facility ACCEPTS the following household hazardous wastes:

Paint and paint products (all types)
Household cleaners

- Aerosols
- Pesticides
- Lawn and garden products
- Automotive fluids
- Used oil
- Fuels
- Car batteries
- Household batteries
- Essentially any household chemicals

The HHW facility DOES NOT ACCEPT the following:

- Commercial or business waste
- Radioactive waste
- Medical waste
- Propane or butane cylinders

Materials should be delivered in original containers. Make sure lids are sealed and that the containers are standing upright in your vehicle. These chemicals should never be placed in the

Unlimited trash bag pick up Friday July 14th

Two weeks each year – the week between Christmas Day and New Year’s Day, and the first full week after July 4th – trash pickup will be unlimited.

Bulky item pick-up

Have your bulky items out by 7:00 AM Wednesday July 5th and it should be picked up within 3 days.

Maple Park is in the zone that is picked up on the 5th day of every **odd** month Bi-Monthly (Odd) months - Bulky items will be collected on the corresponding day during odd-numbered months (January, March, May, July, September, November).

NEW SCAM ALERT

When you call a local florist to order flowers to be delivered to a friend or relative, you assume you are talking to a "local florist."

Maybe not, you may be talking to a person in New Jersey, Texas or California, and when you get your credit card bill, it may be up to \$40 more than you bargained for.

Quick Tip:

Call the local phone number listed in the phone book for the florist. If the person who answers says "Flower Shop" without providing the name of the florist, ask which shop you've called. If the person provides a different answer than the one you've dialed, you may have reached a gatherer or broker.

The Kansas City phone directory lists florists in Liberty, Raytown, Belton and Lenexa that begin with the name of the community but offer no address. When each of the numbers was dialed, a recording identified the business as Flowers With Gifted Elegance.

When an operator was asked for the address, the response was "Route 210." When pressed further, the operator said he was in New Jersey. He also said an \$8.95 handling fee was charged for filling an order.

Don't Give the Burglar a Helping Hand Survey Your Home



Look at your home through a burglar's eyes. Does it look like an easy target? Are there obvious security weaknesses?

Shrubby should not obscure doors and windows. Trim the growth so that a burglar cannot work undetected.

At night leave a few lights burning outside your home. Lights over doorways and garages, and strategically placed floodlights will make your home less inviting to a burglar.

Windows and doors should be securely locked.

Inadequate locks should be replaced or supplemented.

Make your home look occupied at all times.

Common sense is all that is needed to identify most security weaknesses around

your home. To supplement your survey and for more complicated security problems

in Kansas City, contact the Police Community Relations Officer, (816) 437-6229, for a free home security survey.

At your request a Crime Prevention Officer will survey your home and give you his security recommendations.
